### **Medal Presentation.**

On Monday 20 Aug 2018 Brig Gen Joe Mulligan, GOC DFTC, presented Captain Luke Aloysius Mullins (Retd) with the Service Medal and the United Nations Peacekeepers Medal. Luke was born at Graigue, County Kilkenny on 06 Jan 1922 and he joined the army during the Emergency in 1941.

He was commissioned into the Cavalry Corps on 13 Jun 1944 and served in 5 Mot Sqn for the duration of the Emergency. He later served in 4 Mot Sqn and Dep Cav as well as with Dep Engrs. He served overseas in Cyprus with the Armd Car Gp of 9 Inf Gp (Sep 1967 – Mar 1968). He retired voluntarily from the DF in May 1970 and he had a long career as manager of Galway Race Course at Ballybrit.

Luke's daughters Mary and Jane, granddaughter Niamh and son-in-law Joe O'Brien along with club members attended the presentation in Ceannt Officers Mess.

# **Cavalry Corps Memorial Day.**



## Historical Cavalry and Armoured Vehicles Photographs.

#### 1920s.

**1927.** In the Jan 1928 edition of An tOglach, (the forerunner of An Cosantóír), Lt B Kennelly from the Army School of Instruction (the forerunner of the Military College) published an article entitled "The Case For Establishment Of Cyclist Echelons In The Army.

An Experimental Cyclist Coy was formed in 1927 and the article goes into great detail of the establishment, roles, training requirements, the road network, armament, specialist squads and he concludes "The success of the practical tests already carried out, and the existence of data relative to tentative lines of organisation, training and equipment, on which the trials were based, - suggest that the question of establishment cyclist echelons as an important element of our Defence Forces merits exhaustive consideration."

Five years later the Free State Army carried out a large scale field exercise to test the proposed new organisation and structures for the Army and the Cav Corps units included 1 Armd Sqn equipped with Armoured Roll Royce and Lancia AFVs, an experimental Horse Sqn and an experimental Cyclist Sqn.

The exercise involved over five thousand troops and was conducted in Counties, Kildare, Wicklow and south Dublin from 16 to 24 Sep 1933. The Cav units involved were 1 Horse Sqn commanded by Comdt O'Dwyer, 1 Cyclist Sqn under Lt Charles Heuston and I Armd Car Sqn commanded by Comdt JV Lawless.



This photograph shows the experimental Cyc Coy on the square at Keane Bks and it appeared in the Jan 1928 edition of An tOglach. The nomenclature of the seven Bks in the Curragh were change to the names of the seven signatories of the 1916 Proclamation with effect from 06 Dec 1928 as directed by the Adjutant General Maj Gen Seosamh MacSuibhne in General Routine Order 23 of 1928. Keane Bks was renamed as Dún An Phiarsaigh or Pearse Bks.

### 1930s.

This photograph shows the two L60s Landsverk tanks in training. One tank was delivered in Nov 1935 and the second in 1936.

The two L60s given the designations L-601 and L-602 were assigned to the 2 Armd Sqn and they served alongside the Vickers Medium Tank Mk C.

The L60s remained in service until 1953, one tank is on display in the National Museum Collins Bks Dublin and the other is in the Curragh.



Some believe that this photograph was taken on the Curragh Plains but it is more likely that it was taken in Aug 1936 when the tanks were undergoing mobility testing near the Landsverk factory at Landskrona in Sweden in Aug 1935.

## 1940s.

1942. This photograph shows 11 Cav Regt on parade at Dún Uí Mhaoilíosa, Renmore Galway.

The unit has its genesis in 11 Cyclist Sqn from the Emergency years.

In 1949 the unit was renamed as 11 Mot Sqn FCA.

#### 1960s.

**12 May 1964.** Twenty eight Ford Mark VI armoured cars were manufactured by Thomas Thompson & Co Carlow in 1940 and 1941. Eight Fords were sent to the Congo in Jan 1961 with the Armd Car Gp 34 Inf Bn ONUC and three more Fords were deployed in Jun 1961with the Armd Car Gp 35 Inf Bn.

Two Fords were captured at Jadotville (now Likasi) in Sep 1961, they were recovered by the Armd Car Gp 38 Inf Bn, one at Union Miniere work yard at Kipushi and the second at Mulungwishi power station about twenty five miles north west of Jadotville.

On 12 May 1964 the last DF unit to serve with ONUC, 2 Inf Gp, handed over six Fords to 4 Group of the Congolese Army at Kolwezi Airport

## 1980s.
